KNOW THE FACTS

1 in 10 children will be sexually abused before their 18th birthday.

This statistic does not include non-contact offenses such as digital exploitation, which is up 35% since 2020. According to the CDC, 1 in 7 children will face abuse or neglect this year in the United States. Child abuse and child sexual abuse prevention education in school is critical for preventing child maltreatment and for creating safe spaces for students to disclose abuse.

TITLE FUNDING

Title IV funding is available for schools to support prevention education facilitators and curriculum. Funds are available to all schools within all public school districts and charter schools that receive Title I funding. The three focus areas of Title IV are intended to:

- (A) support a well-rounded education
- (B) create safe and healthy schools
- (C) effectively utilize technology for underserved students.

Prevention education, or body safety, falls under focus area B. Schools who apply and qualify for Title IV funding receive a minimum of \$10,000. The grant is awarded annually for a 27-month period, but funds can be amended at any point during the cycle.

If your school receives Title IV funding, you can amend your application to include prevention education.
